This module will ensure that students are familiar with different forms of money and how they relate to each other. Students will be able to use skills developed in the previous 2 modules to convert where necessary and solve problems/real life scenarios, including identifying correct/appropriate coins/notes and calculating change. The module will build on basic number skills; specifically ensuring that students understand place value, decimal notation and use of a number line to apply addition, subtraction, multiplication and division in order to be able to solve a wide range of everyday scenarios and problems. Students will be encouraged to visit Keepers Coffee shop across the course of the module with staff from school and purchase drinks/food items from the menu, interact with staff in the shop and practice using money to complete a successful purchase.

## Science

Students will be studying a module on the human body (microbes and diseases) and survival (separating mixtures). This is a cross curricular project with other subjects in school. In science they will learn about separating mixtures, and about how diseases are caused and spread.

#### Horticulture
