### A Message from the Principal:

Although school had a difficult start to the term with the lowest staff and student absence rates since the start of the pandemic and the COVID 19 Outbreak Management plan having to be invoked, school remained open for all students, which was not in the case in other specialist provisions across the City. The Outbreak plan was successfully administered and at the end of February COVID 19 rates were reducing across school. Thank you to all parents and carers who supported the increased testing regime at that time.

A new COVID 19 risk assessment is now in place which allows greater freedoms across the school community, including the return to visitors on site. As restrictions are being lifted, we are now returning to some of the school rules that were relaxed during more restricted times. We would ask that when students are returning after Easter Break do so in full school uniform and abide by the mobile devices rules. Students are still to come to school in PE uniform on relevant timetabled days. We are really looking forward to having more parents and carers on site next term and we are planning to host some small events in the near future.

It has been great to see the return of whole school community events, which has had a positive impact on learning and student wellbeing. Students have participated in Children Mental Health Awareness Week, World Book Day, University of Leeds Junior Robot Fighting League and Futures Week with a range of activities, visits and external guests. School is hosting an Alumni event on 30<sup>th</sup> March 2022 for past students and families. The Student Council organised World Book Day and are busy arranging activities for Autism Acceptance Week on the last day of term. Non-uniform days have raised £175.16 for Children in Need and £109.20 for Alder Hey Children's Hospital.

School has been working hard to move across to a new management information system to support more efficient and effective working across school and to provide more transparent information for parent and carers on student progress. Parents will have an opportunity to review their child's progress at the end of this term through this system.

School has been delighted to have 12 new staff members join the Lighthouse Team this term. These staff have been inducted with an extensive training programme, classroom shadowing system and mentoring. Middle and Senior Leaders are currently participating in a Leadership Programme to further develop current and emerging leaders across the organisation. The February training day focussed on support strategies for students and included Occupational Therapist delivering a Sensory Process and Modulation workshop. 13 staff have completed qualifications with Mental Health England this academic year and Helen Manyanya (Deputy Principal) is working towards completing her Senior Mental Health Leader qualification. We are investing in this area of training to help the school further develop our approach to mental health and wellbeing across the organisation for students, staff and the wider community.

School will be in touch about parent events soon and we look forward to seeing you in School after Easter.

# **CPD Update Spring 2022**

The staff at Lighthouse have completed a range of CPD sessions over the Spring Term. These have included a mix of online learning and workshop sessions covering: Data Protection and information sharing, Behaviour support strategies and risk assessments, Asthma for schools, Epilepsy Awareness and Safeguarding Updates.

We have 10 staff who are completing a year-long online learning and networking programme around leadership. The Pathways Programme is allowing staff to enhance their skills in a range of

leadership topics for education. The platform is designed by Discovery Education, with Andrew Hammond and the NAHT Leadership Education Union. The staff completing enjoyed their first face-to-face networking session in



February, covering discussions on building parent partnerships, culture and ethos, developing a curriculum of hope, building successful teams, exploring school development, diversity and inclusion, and effective time management. We will continue to explore more topics alongside our partner East Specialist Inclusive Learning.

Our full school CPD Day, Lighthouse Supports, focused on support strategies within the school, as well as working towards targets within the school wellbeing strategy for both our staff and students.




# **CPD Update Continued**

We had 11 staff complete their Mental Health Champions course accredited by Mental Health England and have joined our Mental Health First Aiders in school to add to our Wellbeing Strategy targets.



Our keynote focus was on Sensory Process and Sensory Modulation for our school and supporting sensory modulation for students and staff. We took part in a sensory exploration session with food, developed sensory spiders and tried a range of Occupational Therapy Equipment.



Our student facing staff also completed a range of workshops from our practical subject areas; Food, Science, Sport, Community and Horticulture. Exploring how to best safely support our students within these sessions and gain the best outcomes.

Business support staff completed training on Parent Pay, Minute taking of Governance and Inventory Audit tool.

### **Employability**

#### Futures Week (7th – 11th March 2022)

As part of National Careers Week – which we call 'Futures Week' here at Lighthouse, we hosted a range of destination-focused activities and lessons which included opportunities for our students to meet with employers.

We launched the week with a fun lunch-time activity where students were asked to guess the first ever jobs our very own Lighthouse staff members had. This encouraged students to think about realistic first-time jobs, how our staff came to working in the Education sector, and helped students understand that many people don't have a 'straightforward' careers pathway as soon as they finish school/college/university....and that's ok! As part of promoting positive wellbeing and in having a community feel across the school, this activity was also

launched across room, which point for over



the whole week in the staff became a great discussion lunch breaks!

On Wednesday 9th March 2022, some of our Key Stage 3 students had the opportunity to visit the University of Leeds to take part in a robotics challenge. The students had a fantastic day out and some will be attending the final in York in the Summer term!

Meanwhile, a few of our Key Stage 4 students had a trip to the local community café - 'The Welcome In' — where they practised writing a job application for a café assistant role. For many of our students, this was the first time they had seen an application form for a job, and they did a fantastic job at filling it out. The activity highlighted key language to cover further in lessons as part of our comprehensive careers programme, and promoted discussions around situations when it is safe to share personal data. We're hoping to work with staff at the Welcome In café again in the coming weeks to repeat this activity for Key Stage 5 students.

To finish off Futures Week on Friday 11th March 2022, students had a go at guessing the jobs that famous people did before they were famous! This activity was well received and students worked well together in their registration groups to complete the quiz.



#### **Visiting Speaker – Leeds Museums & Galleries**

On Wednesday 16th March 2022, we had a visitor from Leeds Museums and Galleries to run two 'Museum & Heritage' sessions with students in Key Stage 3. The students learnt about different job roles within museums including 'front of house' teams, curators and hospitality staff. Students also discussed the exhibitions or artefacts you may see, and how curators decide on which museum they should be placed in. Then, students had the opportunity to hold some real museum artefacts including some infant shoes from the 1860s, some 'lemonade powder' from the 1940s, a sperm whale's tooth and old coins.

Following on from the session, the students were engaged in discussions about the museums they have previously visited; and were eager to ask questions about our local museums and what they have to offer, which was brilliant to see!
