

## Year 7 Catch Up Premium

The Literacy and Numeracy catch-up premium gives state-funded schools, including special schools and alternative provisions settings, additional funding to support year 7 students who did not achieve the expected standards in reading and maths at the end of key stage 2

### **Allocation of use of the Year 7 Literacy and Numeracy Catch Up Premium**

In the last financial year 2017/18 Lighthouse School received **£3,500** literacy and numeracy catch up premium.

The premium was used to fund:

Accelerated Reader – 1 year - total cost £1,500  
Additional speech and language interventions – total cost £1,200  
High interest age, low reading age books - £300  
Additional interventions around EHCP targets - total cost £500

**TOTAL – £3,500**

### Impact:

- All Year 7 students are making expected or above expected progress in Reading
- Higher engagement in reading, (measured by AR scores and use of reading in student-choice time) with significant developments in comprehension skills
- Accelerated progress in expressive and receptive language levels for Year 7 students
- Higher engagement in maths, (measured by Attitude to Learning and attendance)

In the current financial year 2018/19 Lighthouse School received **£4,667** literacy and numeracy catch up premium.

The premium is being used to fund:

Accelerated Reader – total cost £3,078 over three years  
Times Tables Rockstars and other maths-related games - £200  
iPad charging unit to ensure iPads can be used in maths to support with delivery of engaging curriculum - £319  
Additional speech and language interventions - £1,200

**TOTAL - £4,797**

Target Impact:

- All Year 7 students to make expected progress in Reading, Writing, and Maths. 50+% to make above expected progress in Reading.
- All students to have passed a minimum of 3 Star Reading tests
- All students to have made 2+ years progress in Reading Age
- Student engagement (through student voice, ATL, and attendance) to be high in English and Maths.
- All students to have made 18 months+ progress in Expressive and Receptive levels
